Excellence

Since 1976, Eastway has proudly received CARF accreditation. This is the official industry designation that recognizes service standards and best practices. This past year the rigorous review process was done virtually, and the feedback was very positive. The surveyors described our residential facilities as “home-like” and highlighted our innovation in partnerships and new programming. They also noted our holistic approach to our clients’ health by including primary care services in our offerings and commended us on how well our agency incentivizes our staff through bonuses and awards.

Adult Recovery Services

Eastco, Eastway’s employment services, and our Substance Disorder services are now fully integrated into our Adult Recovery Services. We know that meaningful employment can be the key to changing someone’s life. It’s why we’ve joined forces in a community-based approach to employment. The partnership is working. 122 clients received assistance at 56 different placement sites. Most of these sites are new for Eastway. This is progress we’re proud of.



Investments in Eastway

The grants we secure at Eastway are an important source of funding and an innovative way to subsidize new programs or projects.

HUD HOPE Grant—The federal Housing Opportunities for People Everywhere (HOPE) grant was renewed for a 9th consecutive year. The funds from this Housing and Urban Development grant are aimed at reducing homelessness in Montgomery County, a problem all communities are facing.

Montgomery County Sheriff Partnership—Our successful collaboration with local law enforcement to assist residents experiencing mental health crises was bolstered by a new grant. These funds will support our Crisis Intervention Team who ride along with deputies to help assess and de-escalate runs that involve individuals experiencing mental health issues.
